ABOUT THE ARTISTS

The mission of the Negro Ensemble Company, Inc. (NEC) is to provide African-American, African and Caribbean professional artists with an opportunity to learn, to work, to grow and to be nurtured in the performing arts. The NEC presents live theatre performances by and about Black people to a culturally diverse audience that is often under-served by the theatrical community.

Cris Eli Blak (Playwright)

Blak's work has been performed off-Broadway, in London, Canada and Ireland. He's currently the recipient of the Emerging Playwrights Fellowship from The Scoundrel & Scamp Theatre and a selected participant of the Kennedy Center Playwrights Intensive. He strives to create work that reflects the world we live in.

Cynthia Grace Robinson (Playwright)

Robinson is an award-winning playwright, recently awarded the "Not a Moment, But a Movement" commission with Center Theater Group. Works include *Freedom Summer* (NCBlackRep); *Dancing on Eggshells* (Billie Holiday Theatre); *Passing* (New Perspectives Theatre); *Gold Star Mother* (EstroGenius); *Ascension* (NYCFringe); and *Thunder: A Musical Memoir* (NYCFringe). Mona R. Washington (Playwright)

Washington is an award-winning playwright, librettist and activist. A 2021 New Jersey Artist Individual Fellowship recipient, her plays have been performed in Italy and France, as well as the United States.

Daniel Carlton (Director)

Carlton is a award-winning Harlem-based actor, storyteller, playwright, poet, director and teaching artist who has appeared on New York, national and international stages. His work has also been presented in schools, jails, homeless shelters, libraries and every imaginable place there is to perform. Recent projects include: writer/director of *March On* (Apollo Theater, National Black Theater Festival, York College, Playhouse Square Wilmington, Community Tour) and *Pigfoot Mary Says Goodbye To The Harlem Renaissance* (Metropolitan Playhouse, Negro Ensemble Company Tour Showing, Community Works School Tour, Kumble Theater and more).

Carlton is currently directing the national tour of *Jabari Dreams of Freedom* by Nambi E Kelley and its recent run at the New Victory Theater in NYC. He also directed the national tour of *Freedom Riders* (Mad River Theater Company), performed multiple characters in the national tour of *Finding North* by David Gonzalez, is developing a commissioned work with co-writer Nambi E Kelley, and is directing a new hybrid, digital and live play entitled *This Ability* for Chicago Children's Theater. *The Eagle in Harlem*, one of his storytelling shows for younger audiences, has been seen by thousands of school-age children. His roots as an actor with NEC include performing in *Day of Absence* (50th anniversary season), *Perry's Mission*, and many years back, receiving his Equity card for his role in *Anchorman* by NEC alum Paul Cater Harrison.

Ralph McCain (Director)

McCain recently directed the play *Thurgood*, whose star, Doug Wade, won a 2020 AUDELCO Award for Best Solo Performance as well as *The Chickens Come Home to Roost* by Laurence Holder for New Federal Theatre and *A Raisin in the Sun* at the American Theatre of Actors in New York City. His acting roles have included the role of Jim Bono and Gabe in *Fences*, Boyd Henry in *Sundown Names Night Gone Things* and Sunday in New Federal Theater's production of *The Most Dangerous Man in America*. Other stage credits include the portrayal of A. Phillip Randolph in the play *The Good Fights*, Elijah Muhammad in The H.A.D.L.E.Y. Players production of *The Devil* (AUDELCO nominee Best Lead Actor), Rev. Charles Dupree in The Billie Holiday Theatre's production of *The Right Reverend Dupree in Exile* (AUDELCO nominee Best Lead Actor), Sweets Crane in *No Place To Be Somebody*, Wining Boy in *The Piano Lesson* for The Tennessee Repertory Theatre and Black Spectrum Theatre, and Frank in *Flyin' West*. Television credits include *One Life to Live, Another World* and *The Sopranos*; and independent film *Flowers* (SXSW Film Festival), and a soon-to-be-released short film, *un-bind*.

Petronia Paley (Director)

Paley is an award-winning actress, director, playwright and teacher. Some of her recent directing credits include Henry IV, Part 1, Purchase College 2022; Three Mothers (staged reading) Capital Repertory Theatre 2022; and Looking for Leroy, New Federal Theatre 2021.
