As a teenager, she sang with her siblings backing their father, who was the minister of music for their local church. They were known as The Pearson Family, traveling and singing throughout the Midwest. High school plays, musicals and speech tournaments helped prepare her for life as an actress, jazz vocalist and voiceover artist. She received her bachelor's degree from Northwestern University in communications. Her professional career began in New York City, as a national on and off camera commercial principal, making her a very familiar face.
