LIGHTING DESIGN Woodrow F. Dick III MUSIC Brandenburg Concerto No. 2 in F Major, BWV 1047 (Allegro) by Johann Sebastian Bach **MOMIX**, a company of dancer-illusionists under the direction of Moses Pendleton, has been presenting work of exceptional inventiveness and physical beauty for 40 years. From its base in Washington, Connecticut, the company has developed a devoted worldwide following. In addition to stage performances, MOMIX has worked in film and television, as well as corporate advertising, with national commercials for Hanes and Target, and presentations for Mercedes-Benz, Fiat and Pirelli. With performances on PBS's "Dance in America" series, France's Antenne II and Italian RAI television, the company's repertory has been broadcast to 55 countries. The Rhombus Media film of Mussorgsky's *Pictures at an Exhibition* with MOMIX and the Montreal Symphony was a winner of an International Emmy for Best Performing Arts Special. MOMIX was also featured in *IMAGINE*, one of the first 3-D IMAX films released in IMAX theaters worldwide. MOMIX dancers Cynthia Quinn and Karl Baumann, under Moses Pendleton's direction, played the role of "Bluey" in the feature film *F/X2* and *White Widow*, co-choreographed by Pendleton and Quinn, was featured in Robert Altman's movie, *The Company*. With nothing more than light, shadow, fabric, props and the human body, MOMIX continues to astonish and delight audiences on five continents.

Moses Pendleton (Artistic Director)

Pendleton has been one of America's most innovative and widely performed choreographers and directors for almost 50 years. A co-founder of the ground-breaking Pilobolus Dance Theater in 1971, he formed his own company, MOMIX, in 1980. Pendleton has also worked extensively in film, TV and opera and as a choreographer for ballet companies and special events.

Pendleton was born and raised on a dairy farm in Northern Vermont. His earliest experiences as a showman came from exhibiting his family's dairy cows at the Caledonian County Fair. He received his BA in English literature from Dartmouth College in 1971. Pilobolus began touring immediately, and the group shot to fame in the 1970s, performing on Broadway under the sponsorship of Pierre Cardin, touring internationally, and appearing in PBS's Dance in America and Great Performances series.

By the end of the decade, Pendleton had begun to work outside of Pilobolus, performing in and serving as principal choreographer for the Paris Opera's *Intégrale Erik Satie* in 1979 and choreographing the Closing Ceremony of the Winter Olympics at Lake Placid in 1980. In that same year, he created MOMIX, which rapidly established an international reputation for inventive and often illusionistic choreography. The troupe has now been creating new work under his direction and touring worldwide for four decades.

Pendleton has also been active as a performer and choreographer for other companies. He staged Picabia's Dadaist ballet *Relâche* for the Paris Opera Ballet and the Joffrey Ballet, and *Tutuguri*, based on the writings of Artaud, for the Deutsche Oper Berlin. He created the role of the Fool for Yuri Lyubimov's production of Mussorgsky's *Khovanschina* at La Scala, choreographed Rameau's *Platée* for the U.S. Spoleto Festival and contributed choreography to Lina Wertmuller's production of *Carmen* at the Munich State Opera. Pendleton has created new works for the Arizona Ballet and the Aspen Santa Fe Ballet, and he teamed up with Danny Ezralow and David Parsons, both former MOMIX dancers, to choreograph *AEROS* with the Romanian National Gymnastics Team. Most recently, Pendleton choreographed *The Doves of Peace*, featuring Diana Vishneva and 50 Russian ballerinas, for the Opening Ceremony of the 2014 Winter Olympics at Sochi.

Pendleton's film and television work include the feature film *F/X2* with Cynthia Quinn, *Moses Pendleton Presents Moses Pendleton* for ABC ARTS cable (winner of a CINE Golden Eagle award) and *Pictures at an Exhibition* with Charles Dutoit and the Montreal Symphony, which received an International Emmy for Best Performing Arts Special in 1991. Pendleton has also made music videos with Prince, Julian Lennon and Cathy Dennis, among others.

Pendleton is an avid photographer whose work has been presented in Rome, Milan, Florence and Aspen. Images of the sunflower plantings at his home in northwestern Connecticut have been featured in numerous books and articles on gardening. He is the subject of *Salto di Gravita* by Lisavetta Scarbi (1999), and his photographs accompany the sixteen cantos of Phil Holland's *The Dance Must Follow* (2015), which takes Pendleton's own creative process as its subject.

Pendleton was a Guggenheim Fellow in 1977. He was a recipient of the Connecticut Commission on the Arts Governor's Award in 1998. He received the Positano Choreographic Award in 1999 and the 2002 American Choreography Award for his contributions to choreography for film and television. In 2010, Pendleton received an Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts from the University of the Arts in Philadelphia, where he delivered the commencement address. In 2021, Pendleton received the degree of Doctor of Arts, *honoris causa*, from Dartmouth College, his alma mater, for his lifetime contributions to the arts.

Cynthia Quinn (Associate Director)

Quinn grew up in Southern California. She graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of California at Riverside and continued there as an associate in dance for five years. In 1988, she received the University's Alumni Association's Outstanding Young Graduate Award. As a member of Pilobolus in the 1980s, she performed on Broadway and throughout the United States, Europe, Canada, Israel and Japan, and she collaborated on the choreography of Day Two, Elegy for the Moment, Mirage, What Grows in Huygens Window and Stabat Mater. Quinn began performing with MOMIX in 1983 and has toured worldwide with the company. She has appeared in numerous television programs and music videos and has assisted Moses Pendleton in the choreography of Pulcinella for the Ballet Nancy in France, Tutuguri for the Deutsche Oper Berlin, Platée for the Spoleto Festival USA, Les Mariés de la Tour Eiffel in New York, AccorDION for the Zurich-Volksbuhne Theatre, Carmen for the Munich State Opera, as well as Opus Cactus for the Arizona Ballet and Noir Blanc for the Aspen Santa Fe Ballet. She has also appeared as a quest artist with the Ballet Théâtre Française de Nancy, the Deutsche Oper Berlin Ballet, the Munich State Opera and international galas in Italy, France and Japan. Quinn made her film debut as "Bluey" (a role she shared with Karl Baumann) in F/X2. She was a featured performer in the Emmy Award-winning Pictures at an Exhibition with the Montreal Symphony and has also appeared in the 3D IMAX film IMAGINE. Quinn is a board member of the Nutmeg Conservatory in Torrington, Connecticut, and is on the advisory board of the Susan B. Anthony Project. She was featured with RuPaul and k.d. lang for M.A.C. Cosmetics' "Fashion Cares" benefits in Toronto and Vancouver. Quinn is co-choreographer of "White Widow," which is featured prominently in Robert Altman's The Company. Quinn was also featured in the film First Born, with Elisabeth Shue. Most recently, she co-choreographed The Doves of Peace, featuring Diana Vishneva, for the Opening Ceremony of the 2014 Sochi Winter Olympics. Her most rewarding and challenging role, however, has been as a mother to her daughter, Quinn Elisabeth.

Lyvia Baldner (Dancer)

Baldner is originally from Onalaska, Wisconsin. She recently graduated Summa Cum Laude with a BFA in ballet, BA in strategic communication and a pilates teaching certificate from Texas Christian University (TCU). She was acknowledged as a Paul and Judy Andrews Honors Scholar and as the senior scholar among her dance cohort. Her early training was with Kennet and Larissa Oberly. Baldner performed with the Align Dance Theater, Zion Dance Project, Elevator Project at AT&T Performing Arts Center and in Ballet Concerto. Performance highlights at TCU include works by Elizabeth Gilaspy, Keith Saunders, Kara Wilkes, Peter Pucci and *La Bayadere* "Kingdom of the Shades," re-staged by Dr. Jessica Zeller. Baldner's dance film was acknowledged as a quarterfinalist in the Student World Impact Film Festival. Baldner joined MOMIX in March 2024 and is excited to be starting her first season.

Blake Bellanger (Dancer)

Bellanger is a graduate of University of North Carolina School of the Arts, where he received a BFA in contemporary dance with a minor in arts administration. He started dancing in the small town of Clinton, North Carolina when he was nine. He also attended UNCSA for his senior year of high school, where he was first introduced to modern dance techniques, such as Limón and Cunningham. In 2022, Bellanger began his professional dance career with the Marigny Opera Ballet in New Orleans. He has performed works for many choreographers, including Yoshito Sakauraba, Diogo de Lima and Gina Patterson, as well as choreographing works for himself and other students while at UNCSA. For Bellanger, dance is about making connections with others through the artistic expression of human emotion and story. He looks to the dancers of the past and hopes to bring elements of their work into the modern day. Bellanger is also an Eagle Scout, loves hands-on activities and considers himself a jack of all trades. Bellanger joined MOMIX in 2023.

Anthony Bocconi (Dance Captain)

Bocconi was born in Brooklyn, New York. He attended Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music & Art and the Performing Arts, and it was there he found his niche in concert dance while studying ballet and modern. Bocconi continued his dance training at the Ailey/Fordham BFA program under the direction of Melanie Person while spending his summers training at Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, Nederlands Dans Theatre and Springboard Danse Montreal. Bocconi graduated in 2013 and has since worked and toured with Lydia Johnson Dance, The Metropolitan Opera, The Santa Fe Opera, Ballet Nepantla and the Lar Lubovitch Dance Company. In addition to performing on stages worldwide, Bocconi has had the privilege of teaching the next generation of dancers. He has taught both domestically and internationally, taking him from NYC to Canada, Europe and Asia, sharing his love for ballet and modern dance. Bocconi joined MOMIX in 2015.

Jared Bogart (Dancer)

Bogart graduated with a BFA in dance from Jacksonville University and trained during the summers at Orlando Ballet School, Archcore40, Florida Dance Masters and Florida Dance Festival. At Jacksonville University, Bogart worked with artists such as Jennifer Muller, Robert Moses, Jennifer Archibald, Ronen Koresh and Stephanie Martinez. Bogart danced five seasons with Ballet Hispánico under artistic director Eduardo Vilaro, where he worked with renowned choreographers such as Ronald K Brown, Gustavo Ramirez Sansano and Annabelle Lopez Ochoa. He also performed and taught with PARA.MAR Dance Theater under founder and director Stephanie Martinez. He has also performed with Diavolo in Los Angeles under director Jacques Heim. Bogart most recently performed with MOMIX.

Alison Coleman (Dancer)

Originally from Massachusetts, Alison (Ali) Coleman earned her Bachelor of Fine Arts in dance from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. Coleman has since danced professionally in New York City, Los Angeles, Orlando and over 25 countries around the world. Notable performance credits include ABC Network featuring Sting, Disney Channel featuring Meg Donnelly, Walt Disney World's "Hocus Pocus Villain Spectacular", Christmas Wonderland National Tour, Holland America Line, RWS Entertainment Group, Hershey Park, Crawford Jazz Project and Renaissance Theatre Company. Coleman is also a professional video editor and the founder of Dance Mill Media, a media production company that produces entertainment-based video content. Coleman joined MOMIX in 2021.

Madeline Dwyer (Dancer)

Dwyer is a dancer and artist based in New York City. She began training at Stowe Dance Academy in Vermont and later at the Boston Ballet School Pre-Professional Program under Margaret Tracey. She has studied with the School of American Ballet, the Martha Graham School and GALLIM. A summa cum laude graduate of the Ailey/Fordham BFA program in New York, Dwyer performed original works there by Brice Mousset, Darshan Bhuller, Joanna Kotze, Natalie Lamonte and Jacqulyn Buglisi. She has also performed works by Young Soon Kim, Alec Knight and Jesse Obremski and has danced at the Boston Opera House in Mikko Nissinen's *The Nutcracker*. Dwyer is the resident choreographer at Hudson River Opera and a company dancer with White Wave Dance. This is her first season with MOMIX.

Adrienne Elion (Dancer)

Elion has been involved in the arts her whole life, starting onstage at eight months in her mother's arms, growing up in many Pittsburgh theatres. As a wandering soul, she has traveled across America for dance training, performances and internships, as well as traveled internationally for workshops and research. She studied dance and physics at Shenandoah University and there received a master's degree in performing arts leadership and management. Performance highlights include working for Beth Gill, Tiffanie Carson, Dani Maloney Dance and Synetic Theatre. Elion feels so blessed to continue her journey with MOMIX, where she gets to deepen her love of storytelling, illusion and props through dance. Elion joined MOMIX in fall 2021.

Teddy Fatscher (Dancer)

Fatscher was born and raised in Massapequa, Long Island. He attended Long Island High School for the Arts studying dance. Fatscher moved to Philadelphia to further his studies in dance performance at the University of the Arts and graduated with a BFA in modern dance in 2015. The University provided many opportunities to work with world-renowned artists such as Roni Koresh, Douglas Becker and Brian Sanders. Fatscher joined Brian Sanders' JUNK in 2011 which allowed him to perform locally and nationally. Fatscher is a resident aerialist and performer at Fabrika Philadelphia. Most recently, before joining MOMIX, Fatscher worked with Gunnar Montana Productions in *Motel Montana*. Fatscher is also the founder of Matter Movement Group, a local performance group in Philadelphia. Fatscher began dancing with MOMIX in 2021.

Aurelie Garcia (Dancer)

Garcia is a dancer, dance teacher and choreographer. She grew up in the South of France, where she first started dancing at a local dance school. At 18, she moved to New York City to attend The Ailey School, graduating from their scholarship program in 2018. She has performed works by Ray Mercer, Elizabeth Roxas, Tracy Inman, Jacqulyn Buglisi, Talley Beatty, Anabelle Lopez Ochoa, Eduardo Vilaro, Michelle Manzanalez, Jacqulyn Buglisi, Pedro Ruiz and Alvin Ailey. Since moving to New York to pursue her dance career, Garcia has performed with companies such as the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Ballet Hispánico and Ntrinsik Movement, Bloodline Dance Theater, Ann Nuo Spiritual Dance Art, VLDC, OCA Dance and ACBD. Garcia joined MOMIX in 2019.

Kelly Trevlyn-Fatscher (Dancer)

Trevlyn-Fatscher grew up in Media, PA and began her dance training at a young age at the Rock School West in Chester, PA. She later attended Point Park University, graduating with a BA in dance. During her time at Point Park, she had the opportunity to perform original works by world renowned choreographers such as Sidra Bell, Christopher Huggins, Garfield Lemonius, Ron Tassone and Patrick Franz, and spent a summer studying with Hubbard Street Dance Chicago. Since graduating, Trevlyn-Fatscher has performed with Dissonance Dance Theatre, Deviated Theatre, Sharp Dance Company, Nickerson-Rossi Dance, Matter Movement Group, Gunnar Montana Productions and Brian Sanders' JUNK. With JUNK, she appeared and competed on TruTV's *Fake Off* season two where they landed a spot in the semi-finals. Trevlyn-Fatscher has also had the opportunity to perform at the Jacob's Pillow Inside/Out Theatre in Becket, MA and alongside the Philadelphia Orchestra at the Kimmel Center for their productions of *Romeo and Juliet* and *Carmen*, where she played the role of Carmen. Trevlyn-Fatscher joined MOMIX in 2021.

Piper Jo Whitt (Dancer)

Whitt grew up in Dallas, Texas and has been dancing since the young age of three, studying under Brent and Judy Klopfenstein. She is currently finishing her third year in the Jazz & Contemporary Trainee Program at Joffrey Ballet School in NYC. At Joffrey, she has had the opportunity to work with a wide variety of choreographers, including Angelica Stiskin, Michael Waldrop, Adam Barruch and Attila Csiki. Whitt has participated in various intensive workshops, including with Tulsa Ballet, the University of Colorado Dance Program and Joffrey Ballet School. In the last year, Whitt has also modeled and performed at New York Fashion Week. Whitt joined MOMIX in 2024.

Woodrow F. Dick III (Production Manager & Lighting Supervisor)

Dick is MOMIX's go-to guy for anything and everything production-related. He has worked on numerous productions both big and small. Dick joined MOMIX in 2005.

Phoebe Katzin (Costume Designer)

After graduating from Endicott College's fashion design program, Katzin worked for Kitty Daly, building dance costumes and dressmaking. For several years, she lived in New York making costumes for Kitty Leach, Greg Barnes and Allison Conner, among others. Katzin has been instrumental in designing and constructing costumes for MOMIX and Pilobolus for more than 20 years.

Victoria Mazzarelli (Ballet Mistress)
