ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Terry Brennan (Timmy/Writer/Co-Director)

Terry Brennan is a founding member of Tribe of Fools as well as a professional actor, puppeteer and director. Tribe of Fools credits include *Bedlam, Echo, Fool,* and *Echo 2007*. He also directed the critical and audience acclaimed *Armageddon at the Mushroom Village*. Other Philadelphia credits include *Velveteen Rabbit* (two national tours), *Harold and the Purple Crayon* (two national tours) and *Sylvester and the Magic Pebble* (one national tour) with Enchantment Theatre Company. Brennan also served as company manager for three of his tours with Enchantment: *3 Chord Fiction* (BRAT Productions), *Spring Awakening* (EgoPo Theatre Company) and *The Giant Squid* (The Berserker Residents). When Brennan isn't making theatre he enjoys lifting weights, acrobatics and parkour. Brennan is a graduate of The University of Nebraska and The Dell'Arte International School of Physical Theatre. Jess Conda has been working as an actor and teaching artist since 2003. Last season, she was Resident Artist at BRAT Productions, where she conceived, co-produced and collaboratively created *Rock And Awe*, a quarterly rock and roll cabaret series. Recent performances include *The Merry Wives of Windsor* with Shakespeare in Clark Park and most recently, the remount of the rock cabaret *Eternal Glamnation* in the Fringe Festival. Popp is a founding member and a collaborating artist for the Movement Brigade. He has also created original dance theatre pieces entitled *Underground Crossings* and *The Christmas Tango*. This season, he is directing and production managing *The Butterfly Project*, a touring production produced by Wolf Performing Arts Center. This project will tour to schools, religious and community centers

free of charge and culminate in a final performance during the Philadelphia International Festival of the Arts.

Shannon Fitzsimons (Director)

Shannon Fitzsimons is a recent addition to the Philadelphia scene, co-directing this "dark horse hit" in the 2011 Philly Fringe Festival. She primarily works as a performer and lead teaching artist for Enchantment Theatre Company (*Ma Mere L'Oye*, 2012-2013 Symphony Tour and *The Adventures of Harold and the Purple Crayon*, 2009-2011 National Tours). Fitzsimons teaches voice at the Swedesboro Performing Arts Academy and has worked as a teaching artist of theatre and voice throughout the greater Philadelphia and New York regions with Theatre Horizon, Raven's Run Visual and Performing Arts. She also had the privilege of apprenticing at InterAct Theatre Company through the fall and winter of their 2011-2012 season. Fitzsimons received her BA in Theatre and Commedia dell'Arte at the Accademia dell'Arte in Arezzo, Italy.

Nick Mazzuca (Writer)

Born and raised in Omaha, Nebraska, Nick Mazzuca began his career studying Theatre and French at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. He worked with the Nebraska Shakespeare Festival as an assistant director, then moved to Burgundy, France where he taught English. After returning to the U.S., he moved to Philadelphia to work with Tribe of Fools. He earned an MA in English Literature with a Playwriting emphasis under his mentor, Mark Charney. His play, *Through the Blue Door*, was selected for the 2008 WordBRIDGE Playwright's Laboratory. He returned to Philadelphia where he has dedicated himself to genre playwriting.

Jay Wojnarowski (Writer)

Jay Wojnarowski is Co-Founder and Artistic Director of Tribe of Fools, a physical theatre company based in Philadelphia. In 2000, he received a BA in Theatre from DeSales University, with a concentration in Acting/Directing. He also studied and performed Commedia during the theatre department's professional summer program, The Pennsylvania Shakespeare Festival. In 2002, he received a certificate for completing the Professional Training Program from the Dell' Arte International School of Physical Theatre in Blue Lake California where he trained with some of the world's foremost teachers. He also has been trained in Commedia by Italian Maestros Enzo Aronica and Antonio Fava and in clown by Big Apple Circus' Barry Lubin. He's currently pursuing a degree in Business Administration with a dual major in Accounting and Entrepreneurship from Pierce College to better round out his management duties with Tribe of Fools. Wojnarowski also knits, sews, bakes artisan breads, writes, sculpts, makes puppets, paints, builds masks, fools around with basic HTML and has recently taught himself stop motion animation.

Kyle Yackoski (Sound Designer)

Kyle Yackoski is thrilled to be remounting this wonderful piece of theatre. Other sound credits include Tribe of Fool's last show, *Dracula, Night of the Iguana* at South Camden Theatre Company, where he also played the role of Wolfgang, and most recently *Travesties* at Plays and Players. He was also resident sound designer for several summers at Peterborough Players in New Hampshire where he won the 2011 Best Sound Designer New Hampshire Theatre Award.

Christopher Haig (Set Designer)

Christopher Haig has 25 years of experience in theatre and film, both on stage and off.
