

ABOUT THE ARTIST

Arturo Sandoval is one of the world's most acknowledged guardians of jazz trumpet and flugelhorn, as well as a renowned classical artist, pianist and composer. He is one of the most dynamic and vivacious live performers of our time, and has been seen by millions performing live at the Oscar® Awards, the Grammy® Awards and the Billboard® Awards.

Sandoval has been awarded 10 Grammy® Awards and was nominated 19 times. He has also received six Billboard® Awards and an Emmy® Award. His two latest Grammy® award-winning albums, *Dear Diz, Everyday I Think of You* and *Tango Como Yo Te Siento* are available worldwide. His newest CD *Eternamente Manzanero* is a tribute to the legendary composer Armando Manzanero. Sandoval is a 2013 recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

Sandoval has performed with the foremost orchestras in the country and abroad, and has recorded John Williams' *Trumpet Concerto* with the London Symphony Orchestra. His classical artistry has earned him the respect and admiration from the most prestigious conductors, composers and symphony orchestras worldwide.
