The Crossing returns to the composer of The Fifth Century, a rich and profound commissioned work that led to the ensemble's 2018 Grammy® Award for Best Choral Performance, Gavin Bryars is writing a substantial work for unaccompanied choir, a major contribution to the ever-increasing volume of new literature The Crossing aims to inspire. With his signature introspective musical language, at once both grand and intimate, this new work promises to be a welcome meditation in contrast to the temporal chaos of the season and of our world.

A Native Hill for choir a cappella (2018)

Gavin Bryars

Following the success of the previous collaboration between The Crossing and Gavin Bryars (The Fifth Century, for choir and saxophone quartet) Gavin Bryars wrote a substantial new a cappella work, provisionally called A Native Hill, setting texts by the American writer Wendell Berry from his 1968 essay of the same title. Although at first appearance pastoral, Berry's descriptions of the minutiae of his rural existence have a profound metaphysical and even political force. He has been called, a little simplistically perhaps, a modern Thoreau although here his visionary prose has something of the mysticism of Bryars' previous work with The Crossing when he set Thomas Traherne. The composer is able to draw on the close working and personal relationship he has developed with the choir and his intimate knowledge of the singers' individual characteristics.
