In this performance, the quartet will perform works that explore the transformations undergone by the traditional forms of music and dance.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Daedalus Quartet

Since taking first prize at the 2001 Banff International String Quartet Competition, the Daedalus Quartet has performed in many of the world's leading venues, including Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, the Library of Congress, the Corcoran Gallery in Washington, D.C., the Musikverein in Vienna, the Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, and the Cité de la Musique in Paris. In 2017-18 Daedalus received accolades for its performance of the complete quartets of Beethoven as part of its residency at the University of Pennsylvania. Among the works the ensemble has premiered are Laurie San Martin's Six Cuts, Joshua Hey's lens fare from alpha centauri, Joan Tower's White Water, and Fred Lerdahl's Chaconne and Third String Quartet. The Quartet's recordings include the music of Fred Lerdahl, George Perle and Lawrence Dillon, on the Bridge Records label, and Joan Tower's White Water and Dumbarton Quintet (with pianist Blair McMillen) for NAXOS records.

Kinan Abou-afach (Rababeh)

Kinan Abou-afach is a cellist, oud player, composer and recipient of the prestigious Pew Fellowship in 2013. The Syrian-born musician began his musical studies at the age of seven studying at the Arabic Institute of Music in Damascus, where he eventually joined the National Syrian Symphony Orchestra and performed with the Middle Eastern Ensemble.
