Penn Live Arts Opens 50th Anniversary Celebration Season with Community Open House and the Blind Boys of Alabama, September 16-17

(*Philadelphia* – *September 2, 2022*) — <u>Penn Live Arts</u> kicks off its season-long 50th anniversary celebration with a <u>Community Open House</u> on Friday, September 16 and Saturday September 17. The weekend will be headlined by legendary gospel group, the <u>Blind Boys of Alabama</u>.

The festivities begin at 3:30 PM on Friday with a New Orleans-style second-line procession across the Penn campus, led by the **New Breed Brass Band**. Featured on Trombone Shorty's 2022 album, *Lifted*, and winners of New Orleans' "Best Emerging Artist" award, this young upstart band will bring serious NOLA cred to their first-ever Philadelphia appearances. <u>Penn Band Slam</u> follows at 4:00 PM on the Annenberg Center Outdoor Plaza, showcasing some of Penn's hottest student performers. New Breed Brass Band pulls out all the stops in a full performance in the Annenberg Center's Prince Theatre to close the evening.

On Saturday, families can take the ultimate behind-the-scenes tour through the Annenberg Center with Safari, a unique and interactive journey led by the much-loved performers of **Pilobolus**. Award-winning master storyteller **Charlotte Blake Alston** will captivate audiences of all ages with stories and songs from the African and African American oral traditions. National Dance Day will also be celebrated with all invited to participate in the official National Dance Day routine led by hip hop dancer, Virgil "Lil O" Gadson.

The afternoon also includes ticket specials, free snacks, a chance to check out the seats in the Zellerbach Theatre and hear Christopher Gruits, PLA's Executive & Artistic Director, talk about the upcoming season. Visit <u>PennLiveArts.org/OpenHouse</u> for complete open house information.

Saturday evening, the new season officially begins as the five-time Grammy® Award-winning <u>Blind Boys of</u> <u>Alabama</u> take the Zellerbach Theatre stage for their Penn Live Arts debut. With a career that spans 70 years, Blind Boys of Alabama are recognized worldwide as living legends of gospel music. They've appeared on the "Tonight Show," "60 Minutes," and NPR's "Tiny Desk." They've performed at the White House for three presidents and in their home state of Alabama at the closing ceremonies of the 2022 World Games.

About the 2022-23 Season

Penn Live Arts continues the 50th anniversary celebration throughout the <u>2022-23 season</u>. Delayed a year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this major milestone will be commemorated in a year of world and Philadelphia premieres, local debuts, commissioned works and celebrated artists from around the globe. Penn Live Arts is

known for its renowned dance series, and the 2022-23 season stays true to tradition with 10 of the world's great dance companies and most talented choreographers. Rising star saxophonist <u>Lakecia Benjamin</u> serves as the Artistic Advisor for <u>Alice & John: A Coltrane Festival</u> (October 14-23), exploring the tremendous impact this iconic duo had on American music. PLA furthers its longstanding commitment to elevating Black storytelling in two significant residencies: the legendary <u>Negro Ensemble Company</u>, featuring a one-act play festival and a world premiere theatrical work, and Philadelphia's renowned hip hop choreographer, <u>Rennie Harris</u>. And, a new series, entitled <u>ListenHear</u>, profiles important contemporary musical voices.

For younger audiences, the Student Discovery series offers weekday matinees and the annual Philadelphia Children's Festival, established in 1985 as the first event of its kind in the nation. Penn Live Arts emphasizes artistic and intellectual excellence and diversity in its offerings; prioritizes broad inclusiveness in the artists, audiences and groups it serves; and expands arts access by actively engaging a wide range of audiences and inclusive communities from campus, the West Philadelphia neighborhood and the surrounding region.
